Faith as Journey

I was walking home one evening after my on-call shift at Lancaster General Hospital when I was met on the street corner by a couple of young men. Now, I don't know why they thought that anyone would stop to talk to them at 10:30 at night, but there they were, clipboards in hand, taking a survey. "If you were to die tonight, would you go to heaven or hell?" they asked. I looked them over—they seemed safe enough, so I stopped to chat. "Heaven," I said. I think they were taken aback at my certainty. "Are you saved?" they asked. "Yes, I am," I said with confidence. "When were you saved?" they continued. I think they were trying to trip me up.

What followed was a conversation that I think they were, in equal parts, intrigued by and horrified by. I was not a Christian of their mold, and yet I was certain in my faith. How could it be that I was certain of my eternal salvation, but couldn't name the date and the place I was saved. Or felt that the Bible was the word of God, yet didn't feel it can be taken literally in all instances. What kind of a heretic were they dealing with? I didn't further shock them by telling them that I was an ordained clergy person.

One of the gifts of being an Episcopalian is that we are comfortable with the idea that faith is never a once and done kind of thing. While some may have had profound conversion experiences—and that does happen, most of us come to believe and trust in God over the course of many, smaller moments of insight and conversion. For many of us, conversion is more of a journey than a onetime event. Ideally, over the course of a lifetime our faith grows and matures. What we believe about God when we are 9 years old is much different than what we believe when we are 39 years old. As we mature, so should our faith mature.

During Lent this year you are invited to further explore, challenge and affirm the Christian faith of your adulthood. In sermons I will explore some facets of faithful living as a Christian. On Tuesday evenings, we will gather to break bread and chat about the main teachings of our faith from an adult point of view. Mary McCullough will once again offer a quiet morning—a perfect opportunity to spend time with God during this season of looking inward. Look for a list of Lenten activities in this issue of the Herald.

I hope that this year you will take advantage of the season of Lent to further grow your relationship with God.

2016 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Our goal, going into the 2016 Stewardship Campaign was to generate sufficient income to support the targeted budget numbers provided by the Vestry to meet current needs.

Although we were not able to meet the targeted budget number for 2016, we were successful in increasing our pledged income over last year by 7.8%, giving us a total income to date, for 2016, of \$177,100. This increase in income will help us support some of those activities which will affect our ability to be a place were people can have their spiritual lives enhanced, and hopefully, allow us to recommit to growing in our own relationship with God.

January



On Sunday, January 3rd we formally welcomed our new Music Director, Gavin McIlhinney to Church of the Advent. We are so glad to have him on board! (That's Gavin pictured on the left in the music office.)

Sunday, **January 10th** we baptized **Brooklyn Anne Bartley**, daughter of John and Lynn, into Christ's holy apostolic Church.

Sunday, January 31, Victoria Hoppes, Associate for Youth and Camp-

ing Ministries of the Diocese of Pennsylvania, will visit Advent to fill us in on opportunities for our parish youth. Youth and their parents will meet with Victoria during the Church School hour. And after the 10 am service, Victoria will speak to us about the City Camp program, a summer learning opportunity of our diocese.

Sunday, **January 31st** we will again take part in the new outreach program of our **Deanery**— **Sunday evening supper**. This meal takes place at St. Paul's in Elkins part and is meant to provide a meal for people who are cash strapped at the end of the month. This month, Advent will provide the clean-up crew. We'll leave Advent at 5 pm and be back by 7. Sign up on the sheet in the hallway if you can join us.

February

February is the month that Brian Disley continues collecting warm socks, hats, mittens, coats, sweaters and other items for seamen visiting our Philadelphia and New Jersey ports. Brian also collects calendars to distribute to the visitors. Due to a modest response, this collection



will continue through the month of February. Look for the large paper bags in the narthex.

Friday, Saturday and Sunday, February 5-7 are days that we will be doing some major cosmetic work in the narthex. We'll be painting, installing the rest of the new ceiling tiles and rearranging some of the furniture. Lent arrives early this year, beginning on February 10th with Ash Wednesday. Services with imposition of ashes will be at noon and 7 pm. The later service will include music. The Eucharist will be celebrated at both services.

During the week of February 14 —20, candidates for the position of diocesan bishop will visit the diocese. You will have an opportunity to meet the candidates at one of the following gatherings with the candidates:

Snow dates are scheduled for the following week, February 21–27.

Reverend Mary McCullough will visit the parish to conduct a Lenten-themed quiet morning on Saturday, **February 27th**, from 9:00 to 12:30. A simple lunch will follow. Look for a sign-up sheet in the hallway outside Lynn's office.

KEEPING A HOLY LENT

In the early church, the weeks before Easter were used to prepare new Christians for their baptism into the faith at the Easter Vigil service. It was a time of solemn, joyful anticipation. Throughout the life of the Church, Lent has been understood as a time for all of us the renew our commitment to the vows we took at baptism.

Traditionally, Lent has been a time to engage in special learning and special worship, with the culmination of the renewal of our baptismal vows on Easter Eve. Our Easter Vigil will be on **Saturday, March 26th** beginning at 7:30.

This year, there will be several opportunities to deepen your understanding of and participation in our Christian faith. Here are a few to consider:

Keep the Holy Days of Lent by attending worship services on:

Ash Wednesday: February 10, noon and 7 pm (music at 7 pm only)

Maundy Thursday: March 24 at 7 pm

Good Friday: March 25, noon at Advent, 7:30 pm at Hatboro Baptist

Holy Saturday: March 26, Stations of the Cross for families at 10:00 am

Look for special Lenten devotional materials in the narthex to take home and use.

Attend the **Tuesday evening** Lenten gatherings, where we will share a simple meal and talk about some of the fundamentals of our faith using the lenses of both its 1st century origins and our 21st century understandings of the world around us. These will be held on five (5) Tuesdays, from 6 – 7:30 pm, beginning **February 16**.


Blessings in the Struggles
