
Welcome Back Picnic to begin the program year.

RENEWAL AT ADVENT CHEAT SHEET

What is renewal? In a church, renewal means the process of re-energizing a sense of purpose and taking deliberate steps to live into that purpose.

What is the purpose of a church? Here are some of the definitions that talk about that!

"A congregation that is truly being church brings people into a loving, life-giving relationship with God and others that is transformational." <u>Pathways to Renewal</u>

"The mission of the Church is to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ" <u>BCP</u>

What about us? Here is a statement created by the visioning team that captures the essence of who we believe we are called to be.

"The Church of the Advent is an Episcopal parish that is striving to be the presence of Jesus Christ in Hatboro, Pennsylvania. Wherever you may be on your personal spiritual journey, we invite you to join us in our spirit-filled worship, our open exploration of the Christian faith, and our strong commitment to serving our neighborhood." <u>Advent Visioning Team</u>

What does that mean for life at Advent? Here is some of what it means:

Renewal begins when we begin to wrestle with questions that get to the fundamental purpose of church. Questions such as 'what difference is a congregation supposed to make in the lives of its

members and in its surrounding community? What does it mean to be a follower of Jesus? What does it mean to be spiritual? What difference do spiritual practices make?'

Pathways to Renewal

It also means that we have created guidelines to use when considering the appropriateness of current and future activities, programs and other changes. Here are the guidelines:

We will try to build community and deepen relationships: inside the parish, in the surrounding neighborhood, and between the parish and the neighborhood.

We will try to be flexible and entrepreneurial: willing to try new things, to learn from our failures and to try again.

We will try to make a real difference: with realistic, achievable projects and programs that do not exceed our capacities and resources.

Together, we will monitor our progress and evaluate our successes and failures.
